The Community Living Center (CLC) - (formerly the CREC) at the VA Outpatient Clinic in Martinez, California is a state-of-the-art, long-term facility. Many patients are admitted with few or no personal belongings.

- Two, 46” flat screen monitors with 2 DVD players and 1 Wii System in support of neuromuscular exercises under PT supervised treatment program.
- Donations of postage stamps, phone cards, comfort items to include Polydent, Polyclean, hand-held mirrors, travel-size and regular size shampoo, conditioner, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant and small boxes of detergent for laundry purposes are accepted,
- Planetree – Make the inpatient environment more like home – Seasonal decorations are also needed for CLC
- Monetary donations are also accepted to purchase these items when necessary.

- Donations of clothing items to include, new and packaged men's socks and boxer underwear (M/L/XL/XXL or larger) and t-shirts (M/L/XL/XXL or larger) along with gently used jeans, sweaters, jackets, sweat shirts and pants are accepted. Diabetes and circulatory socks are also accepted.
- Day Treatment Program patients attend community outings such as movies and bowling and swimming. We accept monetary donations to support these activities as they re-enter into the community.
- Recreation is in need of the following items: DVD's, CD's, arts and craft supplies, diaries/journals, sport equipment, hand held video games, magnifying glasses, easels, clip-on reading lights and crossword puzzle books.
