As we begin a new ALA year let us all remember what is needed by each unit and district. I will list them below. Make sure that each item is completed as it can become quite problematic. Each District President should remember if your unit treasurer does not do these items it falls upon you to complete. It is the same at the District level. If the treasurer or auditing team does not complete these items it falls on the District President.

- 1. Taxes please make sure that your most recent taxes are filed and a copy of the completed postcard is sent/emailed to Secretary Liz. Remember to use our fiscal year of July1 June 30.
- 2. Make sure that your Fidelity Bond for units and Secretaries are up to date.
- Please make sure that you have a copy of your last audit to make sure you have the correct starting balance. Follow your Constitution and By-laws or Standing rules for further audit frequency etc.
- 4. Last year the Finance Committee asked for the Contributions for the different Department programs ie; Children & Youth TFA, VA&R etc. be paid sooner rather than later. In the past units would sent in the funds at the last moment before convention. Sending a check early allows for there to be more money available earlier for qualifying distribution

National Security Bulletin 2

Hello to all of my Strategic Planning Commissioners. I hope everyone is doing well and strategically planning their year. This is bulletin #2 and by now most strategic planners have their year mapped out.

What is the purpose of National Security? The purpose of the National Security Committee is to promote a strong national defense. Standing Rule #7, Core National Standing Committees.

Key Program Statements:

- Raise awareness of POW/MIAs and the work being performed by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) in the search for missing personnel.
- The ALA National Security program maintains and promotes a strong national defense by strengthening and supporting military service members and their families.
- Support all military families by working with their command group and family readiness groups.
- Support and enhance Legion Family and partner initiatives that strive to improve the Quality of Life (QoL) of our servicemembers and their families.

On September 20, 2024, we observe National POW/MIA Recognition Day. Here a little history:

- National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979 through a proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter. Since then, each subsequent president has issued an annual proclamation commemorating the third Friday in September as National POW/MIA Recognition Day.
- A national-level ceremony is held on every National POW/MIA Recognition Day. Traditionally held at the Pentagon, it features members from each branch of military service and participation from high-ranking officials.
- In addition to the national-level ceremony, observances of National POW/MIA Recognition Day are held across the country on military installations, ships at sea, State Capitols, schools, and Veterans' facilities.
- No matter where they are held, these National POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremonies share the
 common purpose of honoring those who were held captive and returned, as well as those who remain
 missing.
- Does your Unit/Post observe National POW/MIA Day? If so, does your Unit participate in the ceremony?

I look forward to seeing you all in Clovis. I can't wait to hear all the things you have planned for your Units and Districts.

Bulletin #1 Resolutions Chairman, AKA the Proclaimer 08-05-2024

Hello everyone this year President Linda, AKA Lady Liberty theme "American The Beautiful", with her colors red, white and blue this Proclaimer says "How appropriate for the American Legion Auxiliary". This year I thought I would start my first bulletin by asking and answering a few questions about resolutions.

- How do you title a resolution?
 The tile of the resolution must appropriately reflect the intent. Resolutions begin with "Whereas" statements, which provides the basic facts and reasons for the resolution, and conclude with "Resolved" statements which, identifies the specific proposal for the requestor's course of action.
- 2. What should a resolution look like? All "Resolved" clauses within a resolution should use the objective form of the verb (for example, "Resolved, that the American Legion Auxiliary (ALA), on behalf of its members: (1) supports...; (2) provides...; and (last resolved) urges...") What is a resolution to a problem? Resolution simply means coming up with a solution.
