For the next couple of months this is the time to focus on the deadline dates for the scholarships the Auxiliary offers. So, if your Unit has any Juniors that may be eligible please make sure

they receive this information so they can get their applications in before the deadlines.

Past Department Presidents Junior Scholarship

- a. Applicant must have consecutive membership as a Junior for three years and be current with her membership in the American Legion Auxiliary and must be a child, grandchild or great grandchild of a veteran who served in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following periods -- April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918 -- December 7, 1941 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by Congress.
- b. Applicant must be currently attending high school and will be attending college during the following academic year.
- c. Applicant must be a resident of California or if applicant's eligibility is by current members (Legion or Auxiliary) in California, the applicant may reside elsewhere.
- d. The scholarship shall be payable to the applicant as soon as confirmation has been received by the Department Office from the college of the applicant's choice.
- e. The scholarship must be used within relative dates of one academic year following the award (i.e. September 04 September 05) or be forfeited.

National: Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship

American Legion Auxiliary Junior members are the future of our organization. To reward those who retain their membership into adulthood, the American Legion Auxiliary offers the Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship to current college students. Ten scholarships, in the amount of \$2,500 each, will be awarded to a current college student. Two scholarships will be awarded in each division of the American Legion Auxiliary. The scholarship is a grant, not a loan.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES LINDA DIEBEL

No Article Submitted – Something from the Department of CA Website -

The enrollment in the Auxiliary of many daughters of Legion members too young to take part in the regular meetings and activities of their Units brought about the formation of Junior groups within many Units. Junior members are defined in the National Constitution as follows: Junior membership shall consist of that group under the age of eighteen years, whose activities shall be supervised by the Senior membership. Upon reaching the age of eighteen years, Junior members shall automatically be admitted into active membership with full privileges. "The voting age of eighteen years for members of the American Legion Auxiliary was adopted at the National Convention in Boston in October, 1930.

Tiny Tots The enrollment of Junior members from birth to six years of age is known as Tiny Tot enrollment. Tiny Tot certificates are available through Department Headquarters. Upon reaching the age of six, certificates of

promotion to Junior membership are available. A parent or guardian must sign the application of a Junior member.

Junior members do not form a separate organization but are members of the American Legion Auxiliary, grouped separately so they may be given a program within the scope of their years and understanding. Junior members may not be counted in the minimum of ten members necessary to organize a Unit, as it is believed that it takes at least ten Senior members to efficiently carry on the work of the Unit. In determining delegation representation, Senior and Junior memberships are treated without distinction; all are counted in Department membership. Junior Activities are merely activities for the vounger members which will give them early training in the work of the Auxiliary and inculcate in them the ideals of the Auxiliary. Junior membership is the training ground for active Auxiliary membership. Junior Activities, properly carried out, can also be an important step in teaching the principles of justice, freedom, and democracy to these young people as well.

Junior groups function under the guidance of an advisor and committee from the Senior members. They are organized as a committee of the Unit, conduct their own meetings, and carry out their own activities. The Junior officers shall be known as Honorary Junior officers. Their work should be coordinated with the work of the Senior group, and they should be given part in the regular Unit activities whenever possible so they will feel they are truly a part of the Auxiliary.

Americanism should be a major activity of the Juniors and presented to Them such manner that they will be taught patriotism, citizenship and loyalty to American ideas and principles. Practically all Auxiliary activities can be adapted to Junior use and the Juniors given some participation in all phases of the year's program. The Juniors should be kept active and interested.

Success of the Juniors depend upon the leadership given them by the Unit. The advisor should be a woman capable of handling and reaching children of all ages, keeping alive their

interest, and directing activities which will carry out the purposes of the organization. Details for directing the Junior Activities of an Auxiliary Unit are contained in the Junior Activities Handbook. Suggestions for organizing a Junior group, eligibility rules, installation, initiation, and graduation ceremonies, plans for conducting contests, meetings, and programs, and other suggestions helpful to the Junior chairman are included in this Handbook. The Handbook may be secured from the Department Headquarters.

LEGISLATIVE -C. J. REYES

No Article Submitted – A note from the Department of CA – Chairman

The American Legion Dispatch printed its final newsletter in December 2022? Do not worry! You can sign up for the free Dispatch newsletter at legion.org/newsletters and visit legion.org/dispatch any time. Let us recognize a few legislative terms.

APPROPRIATION: Funds allocated for various departments of government set aside by formal action for specific use. Allows money to be spent; is not actual expenditure record.

COMMITTEE: A body of members appointed by the presiding officer (or another authority specified by the chamber) to consider and make recommendations concerning disposition of bills, resolutions, and other related matters.

Conference committee: A committee composed of members from the two houses specifically appointed to reconcile the differences between House and Senate versions of a bill or bills. Interim committee: A committee established to study or investigate certain matters between annual or biennial legislative sessions and to report to the next regular session.

Joint committee: A committee composed of members from both chambers.

Standing committee: A committee appointed with continuing responsibility in a general issue area or field of legislative activity.

ITEM VETO: An action taken by the governor to prevent the enactment of an item of an appropriation bill; also, may be called line-item veto.

LEGISLATIVE DAY: A day on which either chamber convenes (or both chambers convene) to conduct official business.

PREVIOUS QUESTION: A motion to close debate and bring the pending question or questions to an immediate vote.

SUNSET: Expiration date of a measure.
