In essence, if you bring in a person illegitimately, in many opinions, it's "Stolen Valor." Meaning you are taking away the true meaning of our Veterans and it destroys the integrity of the organization.

These ladies are welcome as Guests. Speaking of Guests and this applies to ALL Posts. A Guest is just that. AL is PRIVATE membership. So, you must be present with that Guest and hold a 2025 Membership card. It is mandatory to sign that guest book. When you leave, the guest must leave unless another member can have them sign in under them. A bartender working cannot sign in a guest. A bartender does not have say over American Legion rules and the ABC. The public is welcome to all legitimate Fundraisers. Check out what that means. Protect the American Legion and follow the rules. Or you could be responsible for a fine from the ABC or closure.

Is your EIN current and all taxes paid? If not, you had better get on it and get help from the District. Your lack of government compliance has consequences.

AUXILIARY EMERGENCY FUND DIANA LIVAS

Happy Holidays,

Over the past few months, questions have been asked about AEF and how we distribute funds and who is eligible. I hope this helps answer those questions.

In 1970, funded by memorial gifts from Units, a loan from Auxiliary funds, and an inheritance to the Auxiliary from a former member, the Auxiliary Emergency Fund was established. This fund, which provides emergency assistance to a member for a limited period of time. Members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have maintained membership for at least the immediate past two years and who have paid their dues for the current year (three consecutive years of membership) are eligible to apply.

Another kind of emergency has been recognized by the Auxiliary – the emergency an auxiliary woman faces when she is suddenly single, deserted, divorced, or widowed, with no skills to support herself or her family. It is to give immediate, rather than long-term, assistance.

These funds provide assistance for.

- Financial crisis to help pay for shelter and utilities.
 Funds are not available to settle accumulated debts, or to help with medical expenses.
- 2. Disaster relief to help pay for food and shelter due to weather-related emergencies and natural disasters.
- 3. Educational training due to life changes such as death of a spouse, divorce, or separation, necessitating the Auxiliary member to assume the role of primary source of support for her family.

Duties for the Auxiliary Emergency Fund Chairperson:

- 1. Encourage chairmanship in each Unit
- 2. Encourage distribution of information (brochure) to every member when they receive their membership card



- 3. Make Applications available to each unit through Department Office
- 4. Encourage contributions through Unit Memorials
- Monthly bulletins from Division Chairman to Departments
- 6. California increase donations to Displaced Homemakers Fund
- 7. Note: Donations have increased from \$50 to \$100 in order to receive an AEF pin

POPPY GAIL DIEBEL

After World War I, the poppies flourished in Europe. Scientists attributed the growth to soils in France and Belgium becoming enriched with lime from the rubble left by the war. From the dirt and mud grew a beautiful red poppy. The red poppy came to symbolize the blood shed during battle following the publication of the wartime poem "In Flanders Fields." The poem was written by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, M.D. while serving on the front lines. On September 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of the American Legion family to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. In 1924, the distribution of poppies became a national program of the American Legion.

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie, In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders fields.
