Message from the Commander

My heart goes out to everyone who has experienced hardship or tragedy during our recent fires. More than 130 veterans (and counting) have lost their homes. If you have suffered from the fires, the CA Disaster & Emergency Relief Fund may provide immediate emergency assistance to current members of The American Legion. The applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence or evacuated due to official government order, and unable to return to the residence because of unsafe conditions or damage, and had out-of-pocket expenses for food, clothing, and shelter. Only one grant is available per household for each disaster and cannot exceed \$1,000 for Legionnaires, or \$500 for Auxiliary and Sons members. https://calegion.org/california-disaster-relief-grant/

In addition, affected individuals may apply for assistance from the National American Legion Emergency Fund (a one-time grant up to \$3000). https://www.legion.org/get-involved/community-programs/ national-emergency-fund/request-assistance

If you haven't heard, American Legion Post 283 in Pacific Palisades is one of the few remaining public buildings in that area. Their facilities will serve as a hub for relief efforts, offering 24-hour access to utilities, meeting space, and communications for residents, first responders, and relief organizations. Legion To Have World War II Meeting Mar. 14

World War II veterans will be honored on Wednesday, March 14 at a meeting of the Tujunga American Legion Post No. 250, to give them an opportunity to get better acquainted. The liaison committee, headed by Chuck Brown, as well as the majority of the Post members, feels that it is time for these vets to start taking an active interest in the functions of the Post.

About eighty per cent of the service department's work and expense is incurred in helping these comrades, so it is to their interest that they should know how to take an active part in all activities. Just paying dues is not enough.

The post stations will be occupied by World War II veterans, and Lee Warburton, the State Liaison chairman, is expected to come and present an outline of his program

Any World War II vet, whether a member or not, is invited to attend

On the same evening the Tuiunga American Legion Auxiliary will have a dinner and birthday party.

Moe Furman won the War Bond given by Jack Raymond, nast commander of 17th district, to a member of the Triunga Post making the best grade in an examination on the benefits of the GI Bill




