



HOW AMERICAN LEGION POSTS ARE LEADING THE WAY

American Legion posts and members are raising awareness about PTSD and veteran suicide by providing resources, hope and camaraderie for those at risk.

VETS 4 VETERANS

Who: American Legion Post 171, Crystal Lake, III.

What: The day-long event, which debuted in 2021, connects local veterans to dozens of local service providers that offer different resources related to mental wellness.

Impact: More than 100 veterans turned out for the most recent event. By connecting these veterans directly with service providers, the nonprofits are able to assist more veterans and, in turn, veterans are able to receive the help they need.

2.2 FOR HEROES

Who: American Legion Burrows-Young Post 114, Volge, S.D.

What: A 2.2 for Heroes event was held at the Volga Veterans Memorial where participants walked, ran, biked, roller bladed or even rode a motorized scooter, for 2.2 miles. When participants crossed the finish line, they received a dog tag that featured the American flag, 2.2 for Heroes and the Legion emblem.

Impact: in its inaugural event, the post rallied its community to raise \$7,000 toward local programs that assist veterans in crisis.

OPERATION IRON RUCK

Who: American Legion Department of Alabama

What: The department supports student veterans who ruck 151 miles for the Operation Iron Ruck, leading up to the annual Alabama-Auburn football game in November. Each participant carries rucks weighing between 17


and 22 pounds, representing the estimated number of veterans who die by suicide daily. Impact: In 2021, an American Legion Operation Comfort Warriors grant paid for the items in the rucks. After the march, those Items – tolletries, socks and other comfort Items – were distributed to homeless veterans.

BIGFOOT SCAVENGER HUNT

Who: American Legion Post 4, Billings, Mont.

What: After a friend's death by suicide, Legionnaire Jim Clark created Post 4's Bigfoot Scavenger Hunt for Halloween. Each of the 12 stops provided community resources for veterans who may not know where to go for help.

Impact: The inaugural event educated about 30 participants. They all came up to me, gave me hugs and said, 'Jim, we had a blast. We learned a ton about what veteran resources are available in our community. We're going to tell everybody we know about it."

"The purpose of the Americanism program is to promote patriotism and responsible citizenship (Standing Rules #6, Core National Standing Committees)."

This month's focus program is "Americanism", but really this program is always a focus and at the Heart of everything we do/participate in! We furthermore solidify this commitment and ideology every time we collectively meet and recite our pledge of the preamble to the American Legion Auxiliary constitution "to foster and perpetuate a 100% Americanism." So, let's consider this instead a celebration month of what all our Units/members have been doing, share our stories, traditions and ideas.

To kick off our celebration month I am proud to announce that at January's D.E.C. meeting our District accepted a plaque on behalf of Unit 222, Laguna Beach which was respectively awarded at this year's National Convention for the Western Division Dorothy Pearl Most Outstanding Unit Americanism Program. We will be presenting this plaque to the Unit at our District meeting.

Be knowledgeable on flag history, etiquette, and proper disposal methods, and promote the observation of patriotic holidays so your community will look to the ALA for information. Take the time to review/read resources which are available online through the American Legion and ALA National websites or in printed flyers/brochures you can order through Flag & Emblem. I've attached a brief history of the Pledge of Allegiance to get you started. District has also previously provided, through earlier editions of this year's newsletter, listing of Holidays and Days of Observance we would encourage you to review with your members at monthly meetings and include on Post/Unit calendars. National has also issued a FUN video challenge for "You're a Grand Old Flag." Details are attached & submissions can be sent to me or directly uploaded onto the National American Legion Auxiliary Americanism Program Face Book page.

Increase participation in the Americanism Essay Contest. Remember there are two opportunities/contests available, one at the Department/State level open to grades 4th - 12th that awards cash prizes and/or scholarships and another at the National level for grades 3rd - 12th including special needs categories for both. Our District goal would be to have participants/submissions this year for all groups/grade levels especially for the Department contest and participation in the National contest as well. Remember that your Unit will judge all entries you receive and only submit the first-place essay for each group to District for consideration (but please recognize all your participants at the local Unit level with certificates/citations of participation if you are able to). Essays are due to District March 1st (or by next month's district meeting). I've attached again the cover sheets for each contest that must accompany your essay submissions.

Star Spangled Kids - the ALA's initiative to educate our youth about United States history, Americanism, and the U.S. Constitution. Sponsor kids activities, veteran/service member school visits, distribute coloring books/pocket constitutions and other educational publications in conjunction with local schools, youth groups, and your Unit Junior members. Star Spangled Kid Kits are one of the ways to accomplish and promote this and a key priority that is even included on year-end reporting. Last month I handed out inspiration examples to each Unit of what a Kid Kit

could look like (with a little Department of CA themed/Betsy Ross tribute) and challenged all Units to assemble and distribute their own kits. I've attached a picture of what our customized District inspiration Kits included and a resource page of some other item examples you can order through the Flag & Emblem website. Please track and report how many kits your Units have distributed.

Take pictures! It wouldn't be a proper celebration if we couldn't share photos of our Units/members in action or create a "memory book" of this year's events and accomplishments. Just like flying/displaying your American Flag, these photos are a symbol and visual representation of our commitment to our Country, those who served, continue to serve, made the ultimate scarified for our freedom/rights, and our communities at large while also providing inspiration.

Thank you all again for all that you have done and continue to do!

WE HAVE A SPECIAL REQUEST FROM ONE OF OUR OVERSEAS COMMISSARIES: THEY NEED COUPONS!

This is a great opportunity to get members involved in working the mission of National Security, especially those members who may be homebound.

Below are some helpful tips and the contact information on where to send the coupons:

- Only Manufacturer's Coupons may be used. This can include coupons for food, non-food items like hygiene or cleaning supplies, baby items such as diapers, and pet supplies. The commissary is unable to accept store coupons, restaurant coupons or internet coupons.
- Cut out the coupons. Please do not send sheets of unclipped coupons.
- Overseas Commissaries are permitted to accept expired manufacturer coupons up to 6 months past the expiration date. Be sure to consider the time it will take to mail the coupons and for the commissary to sort.
- Try and sort the coupons before mailing: separate the expired (or soon to expire) from the non-expired. Then separate and group together by type: Food, Non-food, baby & children, and pets.
